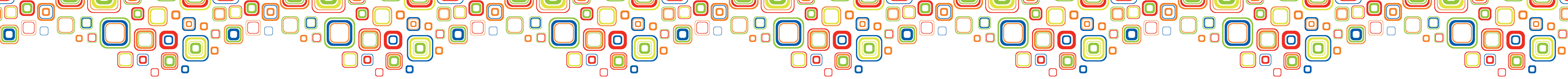

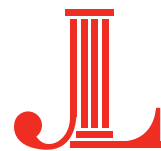

## About Us

Founded in 1914, we are part of the Association of Junior Leagues International, which is made up of 296 Junior Leagues in four countries.

JLKCMO reaches out to women of all races, religions and national origins, who demonstrate an interest in and commitment to voluntarism. Our League currently numbers over 1,400 strong. We welcomed 137 new members for the 2009-10 League year. We are women who work full-time, part-time and in the home; single women, married women and mothers. We are women who share diverse interests and backgrounds, as well as a desire to improve our community through volunteer action and grant-making. The age range of our active membership is 22-50 years old (the average is 33 years old). Seventy four percent of our members are employed full or part-time; 73% are married, and 46% have children.

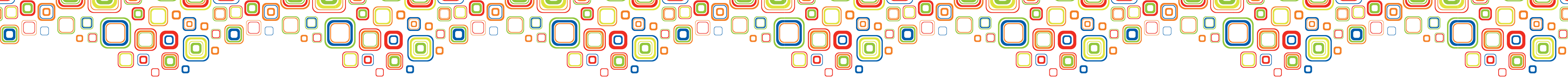

## President's Letter

The Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri is celebrating our 96th year since our inception in 1914. We looked to our past to plan for the future by focusing on membership enrichment, a fund development plan and community opportunities. These priorities aim to strengthen our organization to better serve our members and the community.

Our organization is strong with more than 1,400 members committed to promoting voluntarism, developing the potential of women and improving communities through effective action and leadership of trained volunteers. The impact that the League makes in the community is possible due to the dedication of our members, which include about 450 active volunteers who each give approximately 40 hours a year in service on behalf of the Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri. Beyond their active membership years, the League's 800 sustaining members continue to serve the League and the community through their leadership.

This year we concluded our 10 year commitment to Children's Literacy. Fifty-six members volunteered 1,680 hours and funded \$82,000 to 13 agency partners. This year was the eighth year for the League to participate in Hooked on Books and we collected 45,000 books, bringing the overall campaign to 760,000 books.

As you read through this report you will find stories about how we make an impact in the community. You will see facts and figures about the agencies we have served. What is harder to capture is the impact on the hearts of the volunteers who make up the Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri. Each year, the League trains and educates its volunteers to make a difference in the community. Those reading to the children, those collecting, sorting and distributing books, those researching agencies to assist, those in leadership positions and those working directly with our community partners. The real measure of success is in our communities, by the lives that are changed – including our own.

Our fundraisers, Holiday Mart and the Resale Boutique, allow us to directly improve our community. This year Holiday Mart raised \$560,000.00 in profit, and our attendance was up 3%. We are grateful to our sponsors for all of their support. Without these donors we could not do all that we do in the community. This year's board made the very difficult decision not to continue in the rummage business and the Junior League Resale Boutique will close its doors next year after 77 years in business.

Through the support of our wonderful benefactors, community advisors and volunteers, the Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri has been able to "live its legacy" this year. Thank you for your generous support – we are grateful for your commitment to the League's mission. It is with great excitement that we look forward to the year ahead. On behalf of the Board of Directors and membership, it has been an honor to serve the Kansas City Community and it has been my privilege to serve as this year's President.

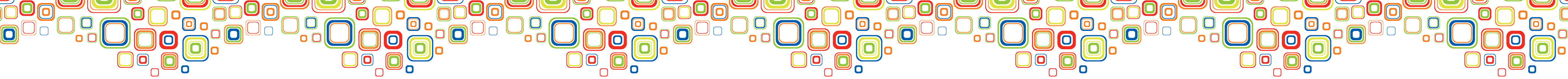

Since 1914 the Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri has donated more than \$13 million and has volunteered more than 2.2 million hours to more than one hundred organizations in the Kansas City community. The Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri is committed to developing partnerships with community organizations and training our League member volunteers who provide approximately 15,000 volunteer hours supporting our efforts in the community every year.

Our two main fundraisers are the Junior League Resale Boutique and Holiday Mart. Our primary impact area is children's literacy. In 2009-10, more than 85% of JLKCMO's net fundraising income supported its mission. In addition, we invest in training our volunteers who provide an estimated 15,000 volunteer hours supporting our efforts in the community each year.

## Junior League Resale Boutique



The Junior League Resale Boutique opened its doors in 1934 and is the Junior League's oldest fundraiser. Located at 6398 Troost, the Resale Boutique offers many wonderful items at reasonable prices! The resale shop, featuring donors' gently used merchandise, is run by a paid staff. Junior League members assist in receiving donations, restocking the shop and running the cash registers. In 2009 the Resale Boutique celebrated its 75th anniversary.

## Holiday Mart 2009

The Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri, organizes the Holiday Mart event, an upscale fall shopping extravaganza. Each year, Holiday Mart features more than 200 specialty retailers and attracts over 22,000 shoppers. Thanks to our generous sponsors and shoppers, proceeds from Holiday Mart benefit the JLKCMO, its volunteer and financial commitment to the community. Since it began in 1988, Holiday Mart has helped to raise more than \$5 million for Kansas City community projects.



Holiday Mart 2009 achieved impressive financial results, including an estimated profit of \$560,000 and increased shopper attendance of +3%. The Holiday Mart 2009 was a resounding success thanks to the hard work of the Holiday Mart Committee's, the support of Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri members and the Holiday Mart benefactors.

2009 Holiday Mart RESULTS:

## Kids in the Kitchen

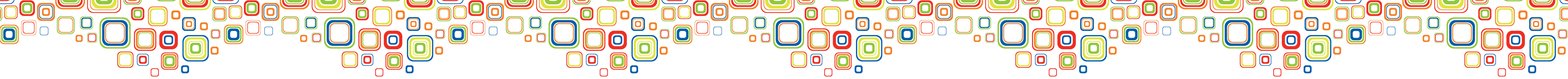


JLKCMO's Leadership Institute partnered with Applebee's Neighborhood Grill and Bar and Boys and Girls Club of Greater Kansas City for the 2010 Kids in the Kitchen event. Forty members of the Boys and Girls Club's Culinary Program, ages 10-15, participated in the event. The program content was a combination of the Boys and Girls Club Culinary Program curriculum and recipes from the Junior League's *In The Kitchen With Kids* cookbook. Junior Leagues' Kids in the Kitchen is an Association-wide initiative of the Association of Junior Leagues International (AJLI) designed to help communities address the urgent issues surrounding childhood obesity and poor nutrition.

The initiative illustrates the power of voluntarism to address community needs on both the grassroots and international levels.

# 10 Years of Children's Literacy Community Impact



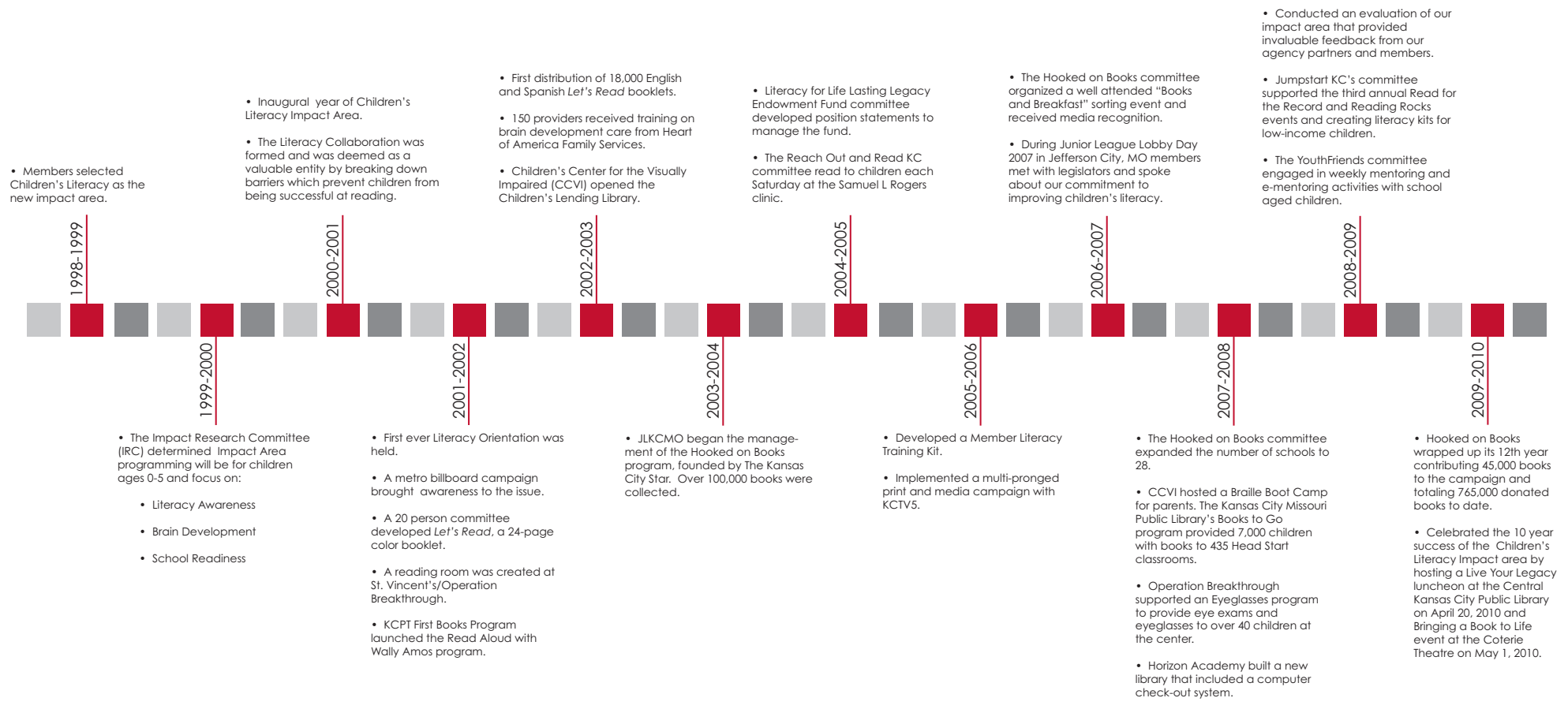
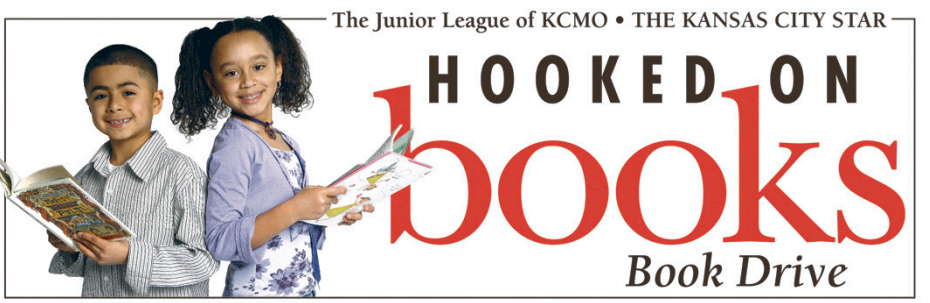
Over the past 10 years, the Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri has provided \$1,305,635 in children's literacy funding, supported 33 literacy community agency partners, provided nearly 1,000 League volunteer placements and logged nearly 30,000 volunteer hours serving the children's literacy initiative.

The Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri wrapped up its 10-year children's literacy community impact area. During the League year, 56 members volunteered 1,680 hours to four community agency partners involved in the signature project Hooked on Books. The League also funded \$82,490 to 13 community partners and their projects related to Children's Literacy. The League concluded its involvement with the Hooked on Books campaign, collecting 45,000 books. Hooked on Books garnered more than 760,000 books (during the past 12 years).

- The Gordon Parks Elementary School committee spent more than 100 hours tutoring students in math and reading during the school year.
- The Kansas City Museum/Union Station committee supported library literacy events and staffed educational museum events.
- In addition to providing more than 300 books to children at Operation Breakthrough, the League also planned and created a family reading environment with scheduled storytelling events.

In closing the year, the Junior League planned and hosted two special events to celebrate the past decade of successful children's literacy community impact. The "Live Your Legacy" Luncheon brought agency partners, Hooked on Books supporters, League members and community leaders together to recognize the success of the Hooked on Books campaign and the League's children's literacy impact. The second event was a special performance of "Frindle," by the Coterie Theatre, where children received a book and special Junior League activity bag to celebrate Children's Literacy.

The League has begun transitioning into its new community impact area – children's nutrition, fitness, and obesity prevention – which will launch in the 2010-2011 League year and continue for five years.

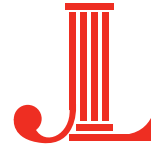
