SERVICE TO OUR COMMUNITY

The Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri, embarked on our second century of service during our 101st year with great pride and achievement. The highlights captured in this year's Annual Report surround advancing our mission of promoting voluntarism, developing the potential of women and improving the Kansas City community.

Our membership remains strong with nearly 1,400 members who have a passion for giving back to our community in many ways. The JLKCMO focused on developing an innovative pilot program, JL360, to further train members in their first three active years of membership. The goal was to immerse participants into interactive experiences and further their knowledge of key areas in the League and community and to provide the tools to be successful in volunteer opportunities.

Because training is an integral part of our organization, we hosted the Association of Junior Leagues International's hosted the Organizational Development Institute. This three-day intensive training program was attended by 250 women, representing a majority of the 293 Leagues worldwide.

Holiday Mart, the League's largest fundraiser, celebrated its 27th year while experiencing increased shopper attendance. Retailers reported increased satisfaction, thus benefitting the entire event.

The JLKCMO also celebrated our fifth and final year of successful community impact within the Children's Nutrition and Fitness area. Our signature program, Healthy U, and 20 community agency programs achieved rewarding results. This was possible through the collective efforts of our members and valuable partners such as Harvesters and University Academy. Results included increased healthy eating behavioral changes, additional physical activity, decreased student discipline incidents and dramatically improved test scores at University Academy. The JLKCMO provided over 20,000 volunteer hours and more than \$500,000 in funding during the past five years.

Finally, as we ended one community impact area, the League made a strategic move based upon the guidance from the AJLI to work within a new platform: Issue Based Community Impact. Our League adopted the focus area of Women and Children with emphasis in the following areas: Women's Self-Sustainability, Abuse and Neglect and Childhood Development. We look forward to successful measured outcomes while meeting important community needs.

It's with great honor and invaluable experience that I respectfully submit results of the 2014 – 2015 year on behalf of the Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri.

Starr Women's Hall of Fame

In 2013, 24 local women's organizations including the Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri, created the Starr Women's Hall of Fame to honor outstanding women past and present in the greater Kansas City area. The Hall of Fame will enable women to draw encouragement and inspiration from stories shared by others. The inaugural class of the Starr Women's Hall of Fame included three honorees who served as members of the Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri. These women include:

- **Adele Hall** - Civic leader, philanthropist and past president of the League.
- **Shirley Bush Helzberg** - Civic leader, educator, businesswoman, philanthropist and sustainer of the League.
- **Martha Jane Starr** - Philanthropist, community activist and past president of the League for whom the Hall of Fame is named.



In 2010, The Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri embarked on a five-year impact area – Children’s Nutrition and Fitness. Childhood obesity is an issue that threatens the healthy future of one-third of American children ages 6 to 19 – a number that has tripled since 1980. This epidemic puts kids at risk for many weight-related illnesses including diabetes, heart disease and other health problems. When children eat healthy foods the impact is tremendous, including schools seeing a 68% improvement in grades and behavior, an 84% increase in attendance and an 83% improvement in self-esteem.

Due to this severe epidemic and the impact healthy eating can have on future generations, the League committed to raising awareness and promoting healthy lifestyles in for children in Kansas City. Our Healthy U program partnered with Harvesters and University Academy children and families in a comprehensive way, focusing on nutrition, making healthy choices, eating on a budget and fitness programming.



6 Ways Healthy U Fought Childhood Obesity

1 Fighting Food Insecurity: BackSnack Program for University Academy

Provided students with BackSnacks filled with healthy food for the weekend.

2 Making Healthy Food Choices: Teen Eats

Partnered with Harvesters to educate middle school students through a six-week cooking and nutrition program.

3 Family Healthy Food Education: Family Dinners

Developed classes for families to participate in a cooking and nutrition program with Harvesters.

4 Healthy Food Education: Community Garden

Maintained a community garden on the grounds of University Academy.

5 Healthy Lifestyle Programming: Fitness & Exercise Programming

Innovative fitness programming for the students of University Academy.

6 Healthy Programming Integration: Classroom Adoption Program

The League’s New Member classes adopted lower school classrooms for fitness and nutrition education.

Helping Provide Compassionate Care to Kansas Citizens

Lazarus Ministries was a new addition to our Community Partners in 2014-2015. Lazarus Ministries was founded in 1996 and today utilizes over 2,000 volunteers to serve more than 25,000 meals to the homeless and hungry in Kansas City. The organization also provides a free health and eye clinic, a boutique stocked with clothing and personal hygiene items, shower and laundry facilities and a library.

Through our partnership with Lazarus Ministries, League members worked as personal shoppers in the Boutique and helped prepare and serve meals at the women's shelter. Donation drives were held throughout the year to help restock the Boutique with new and used clothing. Members participated in Lazarus Ministries' Trail of Tears in downtown Kansas City. The Trail of Tears depicts the journey of the urban poor as they walk from agency to agency to receive services – a hot meal, clean clothes or an overnight shelter.

Introduction of JL360

During the final months of 2014, The Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri, introduced JL360, a new training program for early Active members. JL360 will offer first through third year Actives a one-year, mission-focused placement that introduces members to all aspects of the League through unique trainings and small group experiences. The program focuses on five competency-based modules including: JL Basics, Financial Management, Governance and Community. This program was created to fill members' needs of being connected and prepared for future League experiences. As the program grows it has the potential to increase membership retention significantly by educating members about all the League has to offer.



Organizational Development Institute in KC

In October 2014, Kansas City was one of three host cities for the annual Organizational Development Institute for the Association of Junior Leagues International (AJLI). More than 250 Junior League members from across the United States joined us in Kansas City for mission-based leadership development meetings. Attendees left with greater knowledge of the Junior League, fresh ideas and plans



to implement what they learned. Georgia Lynch, Past President of the JLKCMO, was the keynote speaker during the Celebrating Voluntarism luncheon hosted during the weekend. The JLKCMO was proud to host League members from across the country for a weekend of learning and growth.



2014 Holiday Mart

In its 27th year, Holiday Mart continued to see wonderful success as a premier shopping event in Kansas City. The 2014 event improved shopper satisfaction, enhanced the retailer experience and increased attendance at the event. Marketing efforts were improved through new print ads, a television spot and a stronger partnership with local new stations. The Holiday Mart serves as the largest fundraiser for the Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri, and allows the League to continue supporting many local organizations.

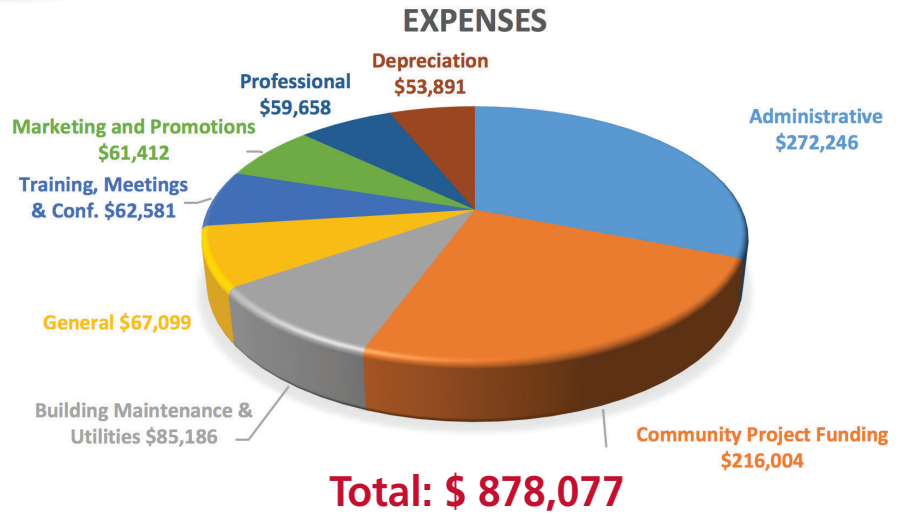
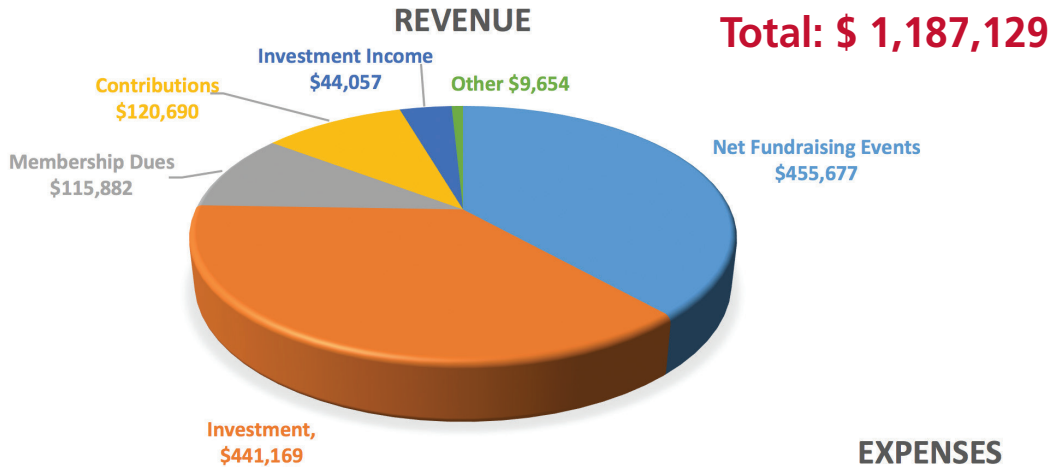
