### 99 Years Building Our Community

The Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri is an active and vibrant organization 1300 women strong who bring together their unique talents to enable each other and support our mission. We believe in promoting voluntarism, developing the potential of women and improving our community. The Junior League has been a presence in Kansas City since 1914 and has left an indelible mark on non-profit agencies and the people living in this region.

Our members have spent 99 years pitching in to effect a positive change wherever there is a need, an opportunity or an opening. Currently, we have focused a significant portion of our volunteer and financial resources into a five-year commitment toward children's fitness and nutrition through a multi-layered program: Healthy U. The program is led by an amazing group of volunteers who show what can be accomplished when you bring together bright minds with a dedication to service. In partnership with Harvesters and University Academy, the Healthy U team staffed a food pantry for teens, stuffed BackSnacks

and brought families together for meals and a series of cooking lessons. After three years of participation, we can measure success with a decline in obesity rates and an increase in student test scores—we are making a difference.

If shining a light on the volunteers who serve in the community weren't enough, the Junior League has another population of volunteers who enable us to bring about change with our fundraisers. This year we celebrated our 25th Holiday Mart with nearly 20,000 shoppers knocking on the doors of Bartle Hall to see the best and most attractive merchandise in Kansas City. While Holiday Mart involves League-wide support from start to finish, it is a committee of 60 women who provide the power to strategize and execute this weekend event netting more than \$550,000. Eighty-three cents of each dollar raised is returned to the community in grants, programs and support. We hope you will join us next year!

Members of the Junior League are proud of their affiliation with the organization and it is an honor to have served among them. Having spent time with our new members

and emerging leaders, I am confident we have a bright future and are prepared to grow into the 21st century.

# HEALTHY U



## Children's Nutrition and Fitness – Our Signature Program, Healthy U



**Now entering its third year, Healthy U is the Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri's signature program: a five-year commitment to supporting children's nutrition and fitness**

Implemented in 2010, Healthy U is the League's five-year, signature program that focuses on supporting the health of children throughout the Kansas City community. Through Healthy U, League members have been able to work directly with students at University Academy, a local charter public school where more than 80 percent of children receive free or reduced price lunches. The Junior League's programs at University Academy aim to fight food insecurity while providing student nutrition education, parent nutrition and cooking education, obesity prevention programming and fitness programming.

Some of the ways in which the League is achieving the goals of this important program include:

- **Family Dinners:** Classes designed to engage families in the preparation of nutritious dinners. In partnership with Harvesters, the League provides family dinner to all participants on a weekly basis.
- **Community Garden:** Maintaining a community garden on the grounds of University Academy.
- **BackSnack Program:** In partnership with Harvesters, provides 150 lower school students at University Academy with healthy food throughout the school year.
- **Fitness & Exercise Programming:** Provides innovative fitness programming to the students of University Academy, including completion of a walking trail, and field trips to Sporting KC and the Chiefs Sports Lab.

# IMPACT AREA



## Children's Nutrition and Fitness

The Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri's commitment to supporting children's health throughout the community extends beyond our Healthy U program. Through various monetary contributions and the dedication of our volunteers, we were able to support a number of other programs that are a part of our impact area, including:

**Girls on the Run:** A partnership with Johnson County, Kansas schools that fosters self-confidence and healthy living. The program centers around training for a 5k at the end of the season.

**Operation Breakthrough:** A partnership with Truman Medical Center that teaches low-income parents to prepare nutritious meals at home.

**PHIT Kids:** A partnership with Children's Mercy Hospital, PHIT (Promoting Health in Teens) Kids is an obesity treatment program that combines a multidisciplinary weight management clinic with behaviorally-based group education for obese youth and their parents/caregivers.

**Kansas City Academy Nutrition and Fitness:** A partnership with Kansas City Academy that builds upon expanded nutrition and fitness program with a goal of positively influencing the health and wellness of students grades 6–12 and their families.

**KU Healthy Hawks:** A partnership with KU Medical Center dedicated to helping children and families overcome weight issues with family-centered weekly meetings, physical fitness and nutrition education.

**Kansas City Community Gardens:** A partnership with the Schoolyard Gardens program that assists schools with establishing and maintaining food gardens on school grounds.

## Community Action: Our Volunteers at Work

The Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri, supports many community organizations beyond those of its impact area. A few highlights of our community action during the 2012-2013 League year include:

### Treat Our Troops

The Treat our Troops committee partnered with Fort Leavenworth to coordinate several events, including a family pumpkin patch day and a holiday dinner hosted on base. Both of these events included snacks, crafts, and fun games for kids. The committee also partnered with Junior League Sustainers to mail handwritten holiday cards to troops, and provided care package items for military personnel serving overseas.

### Action Team

The mission of the Action Team (A-Team) is to provide the community with a task force of volunteers for short-term needs. Typically, A-Team can supply 5 to 15 volunteers for a one or two-day event or community project. During the 2012-2013 League year, A-Team assisted with more than 40 community events and organizations, including Boulevard of Dreams (Dream Factory), Off the Wall (Sheffield Place), Young at Art (MOCSA), Carnival for CASA (Jackson County CASA), CCVI Food Fight (CCVI), and many more.

### Senior Friends

The Senior Friends committee had the pleasure of working with residents at two area senior centers during the 2012-2013 League year: Holmesdale in Kansas City, Missouri, and Brighton Gardens in Prairie Village, Kansas. The committee co-hosted two events with the Little Leaguers committee – a Halloween party and a cookie decorating event, both held at Brighton Gardens. In December, the committee hosted a holiday party at Holmesdale during which all residents received gifts of new socks and clothing. Holmesdale seniors also participated in a spring planting event, decorating pots and planting flowers that were then used to beautify the center’s common areas. The committee also planted a small garden for residents to tend and enjoy throughout the summer months.

## Holiday Mart 2012: Celebrating 25 Years of Great Shopping for a Great Cause

Holiday Mart celebrated its 25th anniversary in 2012, and its second year at Bartle Hall in downtown Kansas City, Missouri. The move to Bartle Hall in 2011 enabled the Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri to bring in an even larger selection of specialty retailers for the tens of thousands of shoppers that flock to Holiday Mart each year.

Several special events were held throughout the weekend to commemorate 25 years of Holiday Mart, which has raised more than \$8 million for the Kansas City community since its inception. On Friday, shoppers enjoyed the VIP treatment during "Ladies' Night Out," with an evening of food, drinks, music, and fun. On Saturday evening, League members, shoppers, and guests attended the "Silver Soiree," where they were treated to a celebratory toast, custom-designed cupcakes, and the opportunity to win a dazzling diamond necklace.

By the end of the weekend, Holiday Mart had raised more than a half a million dollars for the community, continuing its proud tradition of the area's largest and longest-running holiday shopping event.

## Training: The Key To Impactful Voluntearism

The Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri prides itself on improving the community through the action of trained volunteers. The training programs offered to League members are an important part of what we do: they offer opportunities for education on a variety of topics, they increase member engagement within the League and the community, and they enhance the skillsets that our volunteers are able to deliver to the community partners we support. Examples of the training programs that took place during the 2012-2013 League year include:

### Lobby Day

During this annual trip to Jefferson City members have the opportunity to meet with elected officials and advocate on behalf of the League's mission.

### Heart Smart for the Holidays

Attendees learned about the risks of cardiovascular disease in a presentation by Mid-America Cardiology, while sampling heart-healthy foods and discussing how to keep the holidays "heart smart."

### Improving Communication in Your Relationships

An interactive session that gave attendees strategies on how to minimize conflict and improve communication at home and in the workplace.

### Negotiations: Getting to "Yes"

Interactive training exploring negotiation strategies and communication styles.

### Lions and Tigers and Bears, Oh My!

Members enjoyed refreshments at the Kansas City Zoo's new polar bear exhibit while listening to a presentation on the Zoo's 100-year history and its partnership with JLKCMO.

## Training Spotlight: Leadership Institute

Leadership Institute is a unique opportunity for 15-20 League members to spend the year participating in an intense, mission-focused leadership experience. Through this experience, participants enhance their leadership skills, learn more about the League, and prepare for leadership roles both within the League and in other not-for-profit organizations. During the 2012-2013 League year, Leadership Institute co-chairs Dena Nash and Colleen Goldblatt introduced several new opportunities to program participants, including a mentorship program with League sustainers, an "Insider's Guide to Joining the JLKCMO Board of Directors," and a special Leadership Institute project, developed and executed by the participants themselves throughout the course of the year. The project selected was the creation of a "Winter Camp" for 35 seventh-grade girls. Winter Camp, which was developed under the direction of JLKCMO Community Advisor and 41 Action News Anchor Christa Dubill, aimed to promote positivity and self-esteem among the group of girls who were a part of the camp.

## Who We Are

The Junior League of Kansas City, Missouri is a diverse group of women of different ages, backgrounds, and interests, joined together by a shared commitment to improving our community through voluntarism. Active members fulfill their obligation to the organization by accepting a one-year placement in support of either internal (in-League) or external (community) operations. Active members are also required to attend General Membership

Meetings and League-sponsored training sessions. The organization is managed by a Board of Directors and divided into councils that oversee the day-to-day operations of an assigned area. Within each council, chaired committees are assigned to a variety of specific internal or external initiatives that support the council's goals.
